DIVERSITY



Irish people compared to slovaks are more talkative and very friendly. They enjoy small talks. When they say hello to you they like to add: "How are you?" But they don't expect you to answer it. For them it's just polite. Before I was a bit worried about their accent but I soon found out that most people comprehensible english. Very little of irish people have accents that are so strong you don't understand them. They aren't really foodies as their normal, daily meals consist of the same breakfast everyday (which are cereals and toasts) and a frozen meal for dinner. The other thing that was different was the travelling. Dublin is a big city and the public transport is very important because most of the people use it. Normally people use leap cards instead of paying by cash. It is very rare that somebody would want to pay that way. And if you do then you need to have the exact sum of money because the driver won't give you a change.









If you have the opportunity to go and try this experience definitely use it. You can only gain from it. Meet new people, try different things and work abroad is not something that occurs to you everyday. Don't be afraid that you're going to fail something. People there will always help you and if they see it's too much for you they'll let you do something different. Don't be disappointed if not everything is going to be according to your imagination. The best thing you can do is not to have expectations that way you will never be disappinted by the outcome. Don't be recless and remember that you will be given two leap cards in the beggining. Don't use both of them in the first week as once you use it, it will be available for only seven days and won't work afterwards. Also don't loose them because if you do you will have to buy a new one for your money. Be cautious when being in the public transport and don't get lost in thoughts because once you will have to get off you don't want to run down the stairs and loose something behind. Once you do it is forever lost as the means of transport in Dublin are so busy you won't get on the same bus(train, tram) twice. This is from my personal experience. However, most important part is to enjoy your stay to the fullest.









It is a great opportunity for anyone who is not afraid to try new things and experience diversity of cultures on their own skin. It is not an everyday chance to be offered to work abroad as a student. It will improve your communication and help you be more comfortable in communication with foreigners. It is a great experience from which you can draw in your future career or your further studies. And a great way to meet new people and possibly even friends. And if not this then it is an amazing way how to enjoy the citylife in Dublin.
